# General Auction Rules

- What to Bring** Please bring check, Visa or Mastercard as well as your auction catalog with you on auction night.
- Registration** Registration opens at 5:00 PM. At registration, you check in, pick up your bid number. We will swipe your credit card for express pay purposes. Express Pay is required to expedite check-out at the end of the evening.
- Silent Auction** The silent auction is divided into three sections: #1, #2, and the Super Silent section. These sections close at 6:00 PM, 6:30 PM and 7:00 PM, respectively. To bid on an item at a silent auction table, write your bid number next to the bid amount on the bid form that corresponds with your item. Remember that you may skip lines if you wish! As closing time approaches, bidders must step back after writing their bids to allow free access to other bidders. The top single bid at the closing will be circled and the party with that number wins the item. If you REALLY want an item, skip to the GUARANTEED bid, write your bid number, and it is guaranteed to be yours!
- Live Auction** The live auction will begin at 7:30 PM. When bidding in the live auction, please hold your bid card high, with the number facing the auctioneer. The highest bidder that is acknowledged by the auctioneer is the winner and all decisions by the auctioneer are final. Winners will be required to sign the live bid form, acknowledging their purchase of that item.
- Group Purchases** We encourage you to get together with other bidders to purchase items as a group. However, only one bid number will be accepted. The high bidder is responsible for full payment.

# General Auction Rules

**Check-Out** Check-out will open at approximately 9:30 PM. If you registered for Express Pay, you may simply collect the items shown on your receipts and leave. Check, Visa and Mastercard are accepted. After payment, you may claim your items. All items must be taken home with you the night of the auction.

John Hay neither warrants nor represents, and in no way shall be responsible for the correctness of the description, authenticity, authorship, provenance, or condition of the items. 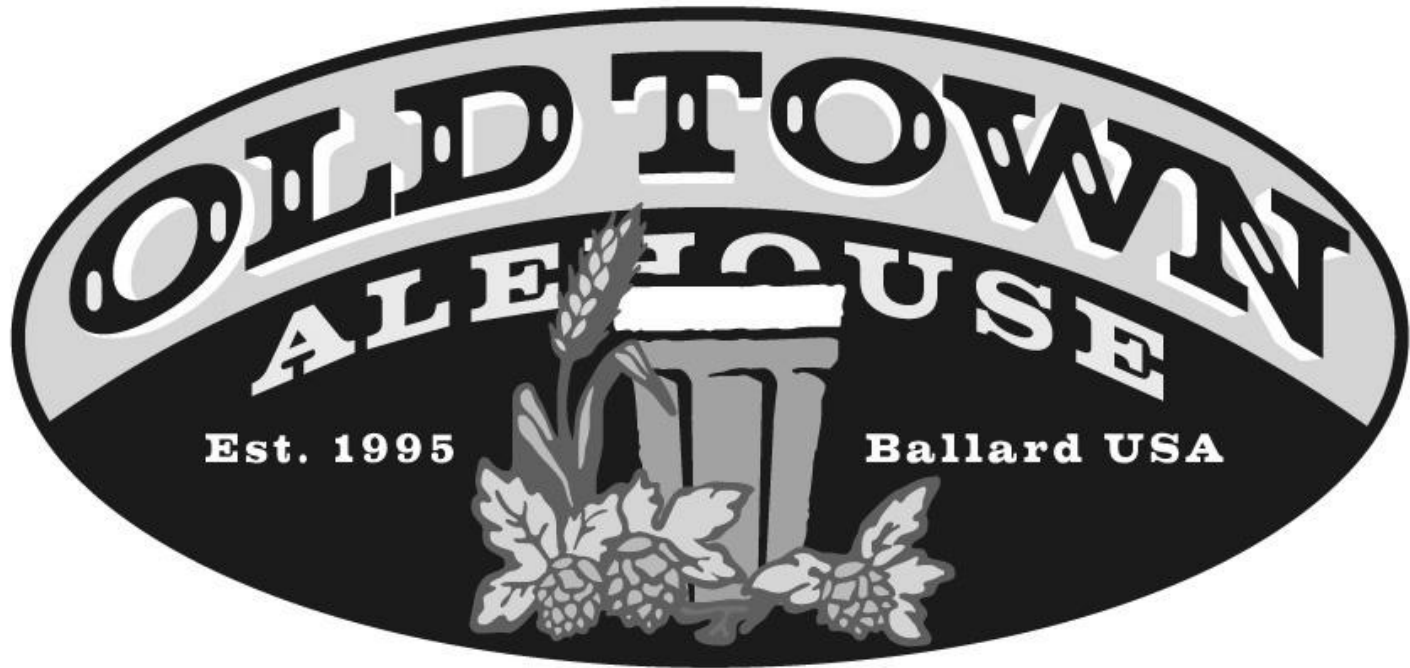
